

A Message From Our Pastor

Dear Friends,

Merry Christmas! In this Christmas week, are you having a breather after the hectic time leading to the Christmas Day? How do you feel after December 25th? A cartoon in the New Yorker magazine says it all. In the middle of the floor is a dried up, withered, Christmas tree. The calendar on the wall



reads December 26. Dad is sitting in his chair with an ice pack on his head. Mom is in a bathrobe and her hair in rollers. The floor is a virtual mountain of torn wrappings, boxes, and bows. Junior is reaching in his stocking to be sure that there is no more candy. In the background we see a table with a thoroughly picked turkey still sitting there. The caption on the cartoon reads simply: *The morning after*. This is normal family life. It is precisely to highlight this normalcy that we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family today!

The Holy Family too was very normal with the ups and downs like in any ordinary family. How consoling it is to realize that the Holy Family was not exempted from difficulties, trials and suffering. Mary was pregnant out of wedlock. Jesus was born in the manger because there was no room in the inn. Joseph led his family to flee to Egypt because of the murderous plan of King Herod to kill the baby Jesus. Mary saw her Son crucified on the Cross. How did they survive? The Holy Family was God centered. That made all the difference.

Recent researches have reaffirmed the importance of family making a significant difference in nurturing the faith of children and adolescents with faith practices at home. John Roberto, a prominent youth minister who founded what is now known as *Center for Ministry Development*, has an article on the USCCB website titled "Partnering with Parents to Nurture Family Faith – Insights from Research." Here are some of the most important practices he lists:

- Reading the Bible as a family and encouraging young people to read the Bible regularly
- Praying together as a family and encouraging young people to pray personally
- Serving people in need as a family and supporting service activities by young people
- Eating together as a family
- ♦ Having family conversations about faith
- Talking about faith, religious issues, and questions and doubts
- Ritualizing important family moments and milestone experiences
- Celebrating holidays and church year seasons at home
- Providing moral instruction
- Being involved in a faith community and participating regularly in Sunday worship as a family

This is why the Church consistently reminds us that the family is the "domestic church." I wish to thank as well as support our parish families who make valiant efforts to live the gospel values despite huge challenges. This New Year gives us an opportunity to introduce some of these practices – if we are not already doing these - in our families. As a first step, why not begin this New Year, the Jubilee Year, by attending our 10 am Mass with family?

May the Christmas blessings stay with you and your family for the whole of 2025!

THE BANDAGE CHANGER

And the Word became flesh and lived among us . . . John 1: 1-18

A rabbi prayed to the great prophet Elijah. "Where," the rabbi asked, "shall I find the Messiah?" "At the gate of the city," the prophet replied. "But how shall I recognize him?" "He sits among the lepers." "Among the lepers!" the rabbi cried. "What is he doing there?"

"He changes their bandages," Elijah replied. "He changes their bandages, one by one."

That is the true mystery of Christmas that we need to live out in our family: that God became one of us, lived among us and came to birth through our moments of joy, grief, despair, anger and fear. Here, in the Christ Child, the sacred is not some abstract concept of theological theory: the love of God takes on a human face, the Word of God becomes "enfleshed" in a child, born in a family, enabling us to transform our hearts in that love and re-create our world in that Word of justice and compassion. Our God knows that our family lives are filled with disappointment, pain and despair; he has lived through the storms and crises we all live through; he has given us hope in our world by promising us life in his world. The challenge of Christmas is to continue to make that love incarnate in our own personal lives and in the lives of those in our families.

EVOLUTION OF THE FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY

Two-thirds of United States families do not eat their meals together. Of the third who do, 50% are watching TV during the meal, and others are on their cell phones. The average child over 8 watches three and a half hours of TV daily, largely because the tired parents use the TV as a baby-sitter at the end of a long day. (Economic Policy Institute).

"Things fall apart; the center cannot hold. Mere anarchy is loosed upon the world." When the Anglo-Irish poet W B Yeats penned these lines in his 1921 poem, "The Second Coming," he might have been speaking of contemporary family life. The Feast of the Holy Family is not as old as one might think. Its origins are found only in the 17th century. In a Church whose bloodline runs back two thousand years, three or four centuries are not a long time. In the first sixteen centuries of our Church, solemn veneration of Mary, her husband, and her Son was a non-event. There was little need to offer the Holy Family as a model, for family life was largely in a healthy condition. But then came the Industrial Age and the birth of cities. Serious problems appeared on the family horizon. Strategist that she is, the Church looked for a counterforce. Cleverly she hit upon devotion to the Holy Family. Yet Mary, her husband, and her Son had to wait until 1921 before today's official feast was created. It was then the threesome of Nazareth officially became the First Family of Christendom west and east. (Fr. James Gilhooley)

THE FRIENDLY BLUE WHALE LAMP!

"Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted . . . " Luke 2: 22-40

It's one of the great television ads of the year. Touching, but real. In the 30-second story created for Home Goods, a little boy is going through the "monsters under the bed" anxiety stage. Each night at bedtime, his understanding mom and dad patiently check for monsters behind the closet door and under his bed. And to further assure him that he has nothing to be afraid of, they place a special lamp, with a friendly whale at the base, to keep him company at night as he falls asleep. The whale lamp works like a charm.


Well, the little boy soon becomes a big brother. And the first night his new baby sister comes home, he goes through all the doors of the nursery and searches under the baby's crib himself to make sure there are no monsters lurking. And then he gives his little sister his first bigbrother gift: his friendly blue whale lamp to keep her company as she falls asleep.

This charming little commercial tells us a lot about what it means to be family: patience to help one another through life's scary passages, selflessness to walk together in hard times, generosity to give from our own need for the good of the family. On this Sunday after Christmas, the Feast of the Holy Family, we celebrate what it means to be a family. Within our families we experience the heights of joy and the depths of pain. The memories we treasure and the values we embrace within our families are the most important and lasting lessons we will ever learn. Our belonging to a family means that each one of us parent and child - reflects for one another the selfless, limitless and unconditional love of Christ the light (a light that can shine even from a friendly blue whale), both in good times and (more importantly) in bad times, in the joy of the birth of new brothers and sisters and the fear of monsters under the bed. "

FAMILY IS THE "DOMESTIC CHURCH"

The Feast of the Holy Family is not just about the Holy Family, but about our own families too. The main purpose of the Feast is to present the Holy Family as the model for all Christian families, and for domestic life in general. Our family life becomes sanctified when we live the life of the Church within our homes. This is called the "domestic church" or the "church in miniature." St. John Chrysostom urged all Christians to make each home a "family church," and in doing so, we sanctify the family unit. It is wonderful to see many of our families already living out this ideal of being the Church in the family by making Christ the center of family and individual life. We all can do more to live this model with these suggestions: reading scripture regularly, praying daily, attending Mass at least on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, imitating the actions of the Holy Family, and so forth, all done together as a family unit.

"AM I NOT VALUABLE IN MY FAMILY?"



NELL KURSHAN Rabbi Neil Kurshan in his book Raising Your RAISING YOUR Child to be a Mensch (a Yiddish word for a CHILD TO BEA person having admirable characteristics such as fortitude and firmness of purpose), tells this real story: A young woman about to be married had come to the Rabbi for counseling. When she told the Rabbi that she hoped she would not make the same mistakes her parents had made, he pressed

her to elaborate. The woman explained that each summer her wealthy parents traveled to Europe while she remained behind with a nanny. One year, when the girl was 11, the housekeeper suddenly quit just shortly before her parents' annual trip to Europe. Upset that their vacation might be jeopardized, the parents quickly found a replacement. A few days before their departure, the girl noticed that her mother had wrapped the family jewels and silverware and placed them in the safe. Since this had never been done before, the girl asked why. Her mother explained that she could not trust the new housekeeper with the family valuables. Though certainly not intended, that insensitive remark so shocked and hurt the little girl that she never forgot it. Wasn't she a family valuable? Didn't she have more value than silver knives and silver forks?

That is a question all of us could ask about our attitudes toward dependent family members, young, old or inbetween, this Holy Family Day. Let us seek God's help to transform dysfunctional families into functional families: God has a plan for our lives, and this plan usually includes a compatible mate and a successful marriage leading to having loving children. The perception of love is essential to a successful family life. If a woman feels loved she will do almost anything for her husband. If a man feels appreciated and loved by his wife, he will do anything for his wife. The good will of the spouses to listen to one another, to acknowledge their faults and to seek pardon and grant pardon are the secrets of a functional family. The children will automatically imbibe these traits. These require daily strengthening of God obtained by the spouses by seeking the anointing and guidance of the Holy Spirit who will touch also each member of the family.

CANCER, HEART DISEASE, AND FAMILY RELATIONSHIP

A few years ago, a study was undertaken to find the U.S. city with the lowest incidence of cancer and heart disease. The winner was Rosetto, Pennsylvania. Soon experts descended upon the city expecting to see a town populated by non-smokers, people who ate the correct food, took regular exercise and kept close track of their cholesterol. To their great surprise, however, the researchers discovered that none of the above was true. They found instead that the city's good health was tied to the close family bonds that prevailed within the community. This suggests that there is much to be said for a close and loving family relationship.

STAR TREK AND FAMILY



When the movie Star Trek III was introduced it became an instant success. Much of its popularity flowed from its science fiction format and its space age technology. But there were other reasons for its success. One of these reasons was the film's human appeal to our deep instincts for family, not only for the natural family as we know it, but also for other family

groups – like parishes, civic organizations and work communities. The crew of the starship Enterprise in the Star Trek movies forms a family. Capt. Kirk is a father-figure who tries to keep the family clan together. Mr. Spock, Dr. McCoy, Scotty the engineer, and all the crew members belong to the Enterprise family. They are bonded together by more than their common work. They share with one another deep feelings of friendship, commitment and loyalty.

In their own way, today's readings from Scripture also focus on family values. Let us extend the boundaries of our family: The homeless man or woman today in the streets of big cities, fighting the cold and the snow, is part of our family. The drug addict in a den, or living in fear and aloneness this day, is member of our family. The sick person, dying, alone, dirty and maybe even obnoxious, is a member of our family. The person sitting in a prison cell for whatever reason is also a child of God, and as such, according to St. John, is a member of our family. All these, as well as the cherished intimate members of our family, are "family valuables," and, as such, are worthy of safekeeping and reverence.

ADVICE FROM THE SUPREME COURT TO FAMILIES




"Make the family a confessional rather than a court room."

A senior Judge of the Supreme Court recently congratulated the bride and

groom in a marriage with a pertinent piece of advice: "See that you never convert your family into a court room; instead let it be a confessional. If the husband and wife start arguing like attorneys, in an attempt to justify their behavior, their family becomes a court of law and nobody wins. On the other hand, if the husband and the wife -- as in a confessional -- are ready to admit their faults and try to correct them, the family becomes a heavenly one." Thus we can avoid the dangers we watch in dysfunctional families as presented in TV in the shows like Married with Children, The Simpson's, Everyone Loves Raymond and Malcolm in the Middle.


