

Dear Friends,

Tomorrow we usher in the New Year 2024! January has its name from the Greek God Janus, who presided over doors and beginnings – appropriate for the beginning of the year. Janus was usually depicted with two faces – one looking backward and the other forward. At this time, it is very healthy to look back to the year that was and look forward to the year that will be.



For me personally, as I look back, there are many events and people that I am thankful to God for, and in particular, the wonderful parishioners of St. Matthias. The most recent occasion was the way the 40th anniversary of my ordination was celebrated as a parish event. I was so very touched by the outpouring of love, support, and prayers. The church was packed with our parishioners and some of my family and friends. Many of you communicated to me your inability to attend. Thanks to Joe Mancuso who livestreamed the Mass (so it is available anytime on our YouTube channel) which was a joyful experience with some cultural practices adding to its beauty. Bill Belford, my first pastor in a New York parish when I first came to the US, focused on the vocation that we are all called to – especially in the Sacrament of Holy Orders and Holy Matrimony. The well worded felicitation given by Didi Molano of the Pastoral Council, representing the whole parish community and the soul-filling music that Joan Seamon directed with our Choir and the Bell Choir were appreciated by all. The food in the cafeteria was varied, plentiful, and delicious, accompanied by song, dance, and words of felicitation - all emceed beautifully by Joe Percoco. All these were meticulously planned and executed by several dedicated parishioners and friends. I am grateful to the Committee that first met in November to plan this event: Alma Valdez, Anne Marie Francis, Emile Capuno, Fran Johnson, Claudette Gaspard, Menchie Ventura, Rita DiNicola, and Frank Rees. Many others gave of their time and talent – too many to name here. In a very special way, I am immensely indebted to Alma and Jaime Valdez for their goodwill and graciousness in sponsoring this event. Echoing the words of Mother Mary, I too say, "My soul glorifies the Lord... for He has done great things for me... Holy is His name." (Luke 1:46)

You too will have many things to be grateful for in looking back at 2023. In the same spirit, let us all look forward to 2024 and make a plan to correct where we failed and to rededicate ourselves to be better with new resolutions with the grace that comes from the Lord. I saw my son playing with a used diaper while the air conditioner was on. It was all fun and games until the poop hit the fan



CAN YOU SEE SALVATION IN YOUR OWN JERUSALEM . . .?

[Simeon] took [the child] into his arms and blessed God, saying: "... my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel..." There was a prophetess, Anna... [who] gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem. Luke 2: 22-40

Her grace and courage in dealing with her illness was an inspiration to all of you. Oh, it was rough when the diagnosis was first determined but she soon found a measure of peace — and gratitude. And your entire family came together to help her make her last days especially happy ones. Yes, she's missed terribly but the memory of your time with her strengthened your bond as a family. In your loved one's spirit of gratitude and peace, in the hope manifested in her courage, you have seen the salvation of God...

Losing your job was devastating. The career you worked so hard to establish was derailed, if not lost altogether. But your first boss who became a mentor called immediately and guided you through that difficult time. Her perspective and advice were invaluable. You found a new position and re-established your career — wiser and humbler as a result. In your mentor's care and support, her wisdom and experience, you have seen the salvation of God . . .

Something had to be done. This situation could not go on any longer. But those in charge dropped the ball; those

responsible were not up to the challenge. So you made some calls. Can we fix this? you asked. Yeah, we can, they all replied. So you all put your individual interests in check and focused on the greater good — and a plan was put in place that made things better without subjecting anyone to suspicion or embarrassment. The good of the community was the focus. In the generosity of heart of these good folks, you witnessed the salvation of God.

You messed up big time, but forgiveness was readily offered and the opportunity to fix your error was afforded. You were pushed aside, thrown under the bus, betrayed — but someone was there to pick you up. In your grief, in your loss, in your brokenness, someone was there to help you put your life back together. In these good folks, you witnessed the salvation of God.

If we're willing to look around our own Jerusalems with eyes of faith, if we can refocus our vision on the good in our tumultuous lives, we can see the "salvation" of God in our midst: God "saves" us from our self-centeredness when a child or elderly parent calls out to us for help; God "saves" us from despair by enabling us to do good and meaningful things with the abilities and resources we possess; God "saves" us from a sense of "deadness" by revealing his compassion in the forgiveness we seek and give. Behold, as the faithful Simeon realizes, the many signs of salvation in our own lives, the many cracks in our overwhelmingly busy days when the light of God's love manages to break through, the many small resurrections we experience when the Spirit of God lifts us out of our hurt and brokenness.

ANNA AMONG US

In Luke's story of the infant Jesus' presentation in the temple, Mary and Joseph encounter Anna, an elderly widow who has dedicated her life to fasting and prayer in the temple.

Luke describes her as "prophetess." Anna — whose name means "grace" — is a figure of hope: despite the hardship of her own life as a widow, she's able to see the goodness of God around her and finds purpose in being a woman of "grace" to everyone she meets in the temple. Like Simeon, Anna realizes who this Child is and what his life will mean to the poor and lost and marginalized, and she doesn't hesitate

to tell others that, in this infant, the Kingdom of God has come.

Anna lives right here in our own parish and community. She is the elderly neighbor who struggles to come to church every day or prays every morning in her room. She keeps a list of all the people she prays for: the granddaughter who just gave birth to her first great-grandchild, the son and daughter-in-law who are going through a difficult time in their relationship, the grandson off to his first year of college, the neighbor about to undergo surgery. She has a kind word for everyone she meets. She radiates kindness and graciousness.

Most families have an "Anna": the grandmother (or grandfather, for that matter) or great aunt (or uncle) who has become a model of kindness and a source of wisdom for the family and who, with compassion and care, provides a listening heart and loving counsel to all who come to her.

We are all called to be "prophets" like Anna: to move beyond our own hardships and sadness to realize the love of God in our midst and "tell" of that love in our own simple and unremarkable acts of kindness and understanding and comfort to those we encounter in the "temples" in which we live and work and play and pray. May we embrace the spirit of hope and thanksgiving of Anna in today's Gospel: always finding reason to hope in the light despite the darkness that overwhelms us, always giving thanks for the love of God ever present in our midst.

THREE WAYS TO BEGIN THE NEW YEAR

William Barclay's three ways to begin the New Year in a meaningful way:

Something <u>to dream</u>: "I have a dream," said Martin Luther King. We should all have a noble plan of action (dream a noble dream) for every day in the New Year.

Something <u>to do</u>: It has been truly said that an idle mind is the devil's workshop. We must not be barren fig trees in God's vineyard. We must be always engaged, doing good to others. And,...

Someone to love: God must be the center of our love and it must be the realization of God's presence which makes others lovable. Let us light a candle instead of blaming the darkness around us. Just as the moon borrows the sun's light to illuminate the earth, we must radiate the light of God within us. We need to remember the proverb: "Cherish your yesterdays; dream your tomorrows; but live your todays."

CANCER, HEART DISEASE AND FAMILY RELATIONSHIPS

A Resolution for the New Year:

Here's an excellent idea: Resolve to start every morning with a short prayer:

"Good morning, Lord. Thank You for extending my life for one more day. Please grant me a special anointing of your Holy Spirit so that I may do your holy will today and avoid everything evil." We might also resolve to say a short prayer, every evening, the last thing we do before we go to sleep: "Thank you Lord for helping me to do your will today. Forgive me, Lord, for saying 'no' to your grace several times today. I am really sorry for all my sins of the day. Please pardon me. And, as we close our eyes, we might say: "Good night, Lord. "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit."

7 Ups for the New Year

1) WAKE UP--Begin the day thanking the Lord. It is His day. Rejoice in it.

2) LOOK-UP--Open your eyes to the Lord. Ask for His strength and blessings for the day. After all, He is your only Savior.

3) **DRESS-UP**--Put on a smile. It improves your looks. It says something about your attitude. It enables Jesus living within you smile at others.

4) **SHUT-UP**--Watch your tongue. Don't gossip. Don't be judgmental. Say nice things. Learn to listen to others with love. Be sympathetic.

5) **STAND-UP**--Take a stand for what you believe. Resist evil. Do good. Have the courage of your Christian convictions by practicing what you believe.

6) **REACH-UP**--Spend time in prayer by talking to God with your adorations, confessions, thanksgivings and supplications to the Lord and by listening to Him by attentively reading the Bible and by applying its message to you life.

7) **LIFT-UP-**Be available to help those in need--serving, supporting, and sharing. Try to find Jesus in others and serve him who lives in others.

Eucharistic The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage (NEP) has publicly launched! The NEP (https://www.eucharisticpilgrimage.org/) will consist of four cross-Pilgrimage United States over a two-month period, beginning during the feast of Pentecost, May 17-19, 2024.

The pilgrimage is being organized by the National Eucharistic Revival campaign in conjunction with Modern Catholic Pilgrim, a Catholic nonprofit dedicated to deepening the faith across the country through pilgrimages.
