



A Message From Our Pastor

Dear Friends,

After honoring mothers last month, today we honor fathers. For children, it is a day to show appreciation and gratitude for their fathers and father-figures. For adults, it is a day to recall and appreciate the hard work of the fathers and husbands in their lives. We offer our dads, living or dead, on



the altar of God during the Holy Mass and invoke our heavenly Father's blessings on them. At a time when the Fathers' role in the family and in the society is not fully appreciated, it is good that today we can celebrate, congratulate and pray for the men who continue to reflect the Divine qualities of fatherhood as they lovingly establish, nourish and maintain their families.

Many studies have demonstrated how important a father is to his child's development. Children with fathers present have lower rates of delinquency, drug and alcohol use, teen pregnancy, and so on, than those with absent fathers. The father's presence is also a significant positive factor in children's getting a college education, finding a satisfying job, and making a lasting marriage. Psychotherapists today are saying that both parents are vitally important to the stable development of their children; the mother's input is invaluable in the formative pre-adolescent years but the father's most important influence is at adolescence. Most single mothers, who do an excellent job of parenting, say that it is very difficult to teach their children about the meaning of God the Father who seems so impersonal because their children have been abandoned by their natural fathers. Adolescent daughters long to hear from their fathers that they are beautiful and loved. In fact, a girl's choice of partner and satisfaction in marriage is often directly related to the relationship she has had with her father.

While we honor our earthly fathers, we, as Christians, look up to God as our model of fatherhood. So what does the Bible say about it? Check out these verses on the fatherhood of God: Matthew 5:45; 6:9, 32; Romans 1:7; 15:6; 1 Corinthians 8:6.

There are many instances that speak of Jesus Christ, the Son, honoring His Father and honoring the will of His Father (e.g., John 17:1 and John 17:5).

The apostle Paul taught that to honor one's earthly father is not only a commandment but the first commandment that, when obeyed, has a promise of things going well and living long on the earth. "Honor your father and mother—which is the first commandment with a promise—that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth" (Ephesians 6:2-3).

I invite us all to have a look at a few more Biblical references to fathers: Exodus 20:12, Sirach 3:1-16, Matthew 19:16-22, John 1:14, 2 Cor. 6:16-18, Ephesians 6: 1-4, 1 Thessalonians. 2:11 – 12.

The most important lesson that a father can inculcate in his children is to develop a loving relationship with God. All fathers can heed this advice of St. Paul: "Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord." (Ephesians 6:4). When fathers take this responsibility seriously, there will be more unity, love, peace and harmony in families.

Summer is almost here. Traditionally this is a time of rest and vacations. Have you planned a get-away for just the two of you? Even if you can't take a "real" vacation fantasize together about a dream vacation either at home or away. A staycation counts.

"Impossible is not in God's Dictionary

You remember David, a pre-teen shepherd boy, taking down the mighty soldier Goliath? You remember Moses, the stuttering herdsman who, in a personal interview with God, was directed to liberate his nation from a twothousand-year-old nation? As a boy, Thomas Edison was informed by a teacher that he was too stupid to learn anything. His teacher advised his mother to take him out of school. Albert Einstein seemed so slow and dull that his parents feared that he was mentally deficient. Winston Churchill was admitted to school in the lowest level classes and never moved out of the lowest group in all the years he attended Harrow. But the word "impossible" is not in God's dictionary. Eighty percent of success is perseverance. How do you think Michelangelo got the angel out of the rock? The most successful salespersons are those who try and try again. Walt Disney was fired from his first job because he didn't have any good ideas. Abraham Lincoln entered the Black Hawk War as a captain and came out a private. George Washington Carver, a little known Afro-American agricultural scientist, revolutionized the agriculture of the Southern Unites States with the peanut and the sweet potato.

Today's Gospel teaches us how God causes His Kingdom to grow in human hearts and communities in a slow but steady way. We need not get discouraged: Since the acceptance God's rule by human beings is a very slow process, there is the danger of discouragement and hopelessness among preachers, evangelizers and believers. The conviction that growth of the Kingdom of God is the work of the Holy Spirit with our humble cooperation should make us optimistic in continuing our work of bearing witness to Him. We can all plant tiny seeds in the form of words of love, acts of encouragement, and deeds of charity, mercy and forgiveness. Parents and teachers can plant a lot of seeds in the minds of their children and students. The Holy Spirit will touch the hearts of the recipients of these seeds sown by us and will effect growth of the kingdom in their souls and lives. As the apostle Paul once said of his ministry, | Neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth" . (1 Corinthians 3:7)

A Bowl of the Seasons

"[The kingdom of God] is like a mustard seed...the smallest of all the seeds on earth [but] springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade." Mark 4: 26-34

The bowl sat on the piano in the center of their farmhouse. Their mother had placed a large fluted glass vase in the center; the vase was large enough to hold entire branches. The bowl reflected the unfolding of each season: silver pussy willows in March, apple blossoms in May, ivory dogwood and magnolia branches in the summer, oak leaves in the fall, holly and red berries at Christmas. The bowl was her pride and the seasonal centerpiece of the house - but she insisted that the bowl hold only what she and her children cut and gathered from the land around them. Gifts of flowers from family and friends would be placed elsewhere in the house; the bowl in the heart of their home was reserved for the beauty around them.

Filling the bowl during the year was a family adventure. Writing in The Boston Globe [March 28, 2018], Leila Philip of the College of the Holy Cross, remembers those walks with her mother and siblings:

"Like most things in a large family, getting out of the house involved a great deal of bustle and excitement, and hullabaloo - the finding of socks and boots, hats and lost mittens, the calling of the dogs, does someone have clippers? - Then off we'd go.

"When I was younger, I thought my mother's insistence of never buying cut flowers was another facet of her inherited thrift. A child in the Depression, a teenager at the outbreak of World War II, a professor's daughter, my mother was generous, but rarely bought luxuries. It wasn't until she died that I realized that her bowl and our seasonal walks through the farm were her way of teaching us how to have a connection to the natural world around us, and an awareness of the seasons, our planet's movement, and ours, through time. "It's been a year since my mother died, and I'm nowhere near ready to let her go. I walk down our road to a neighbor's farm, looking for glimmers of silver pussy willows in the swamp, the way my mother taught me."

A mother teaches her children to appreciate the gifts of God in their midst in their walks on their farm and through the woods and pond near their home. The bowl and its contents reflected the spirit of gratitude for the lives each member of the family had been given by God and the bounty of the earth to sustain their lives. Jesus calls us to embrace the joy of such gratitude: though we "know not how" God makes the grain grow and the sun rise and the rain fall, we do know why: all of creation, the perfect and complete love that is and of God that compels God to set

all of creation into motion and to breathe that love into our souls and set us on this life of ours.

A Parable of Encouragement

The parable of the mustard seed is a word of encouragement for us. Things might not be what you and I want them to be, but there is still hope. God works in mysterious ways. God is still with us even when our efforts are frustrated, because He is the source of growth. Growth often starts out small like a mustard seed and then blossoms into something huge.

The second thing these words of Jesus do is to remind us that while we are called to do something, we are not called to do everything. We scatter the seed, but the growth is up to God. The same process works in the Christian life. We practice daily prayer and Bible reading. We find ways to be of service to others. We pledge money and time to the Church and charitable purposes. We join the people of God at the altar regularly. These are some of the seeds that God uses to mold and shape our lives in love, peace and hope. But the shaping happens at God's own pace and as we are able to cooperate with Him.

The Father's Blessing

Gary Smalley, popular author and psychologist, asked 100 people, "What is one specific way you knew that you had received your parents' blessing?" Here are some of those answers:

- 1. "My father would put his arm around me at church and let me lay my head on his shoulder."
- 2. "When my father was facing being transferred at work, he purposely took another job so that I could finish my senior year in high school at the same school."
- 3. "When I wrecked my parent's car, my father's first reaction was to hug me and let me cry instead of yelling at me."
- 4. "When I was thirteen, my dad trusted me to use his favorite hunting rifle when I was invited to go hunting with a friend and his father."
- 5. "My father went with me when I had to take back an ugly dress a saleswoman had talked me into buying."
- 6. "My father would let me practice pitching to him for a long time when he got home from work."
- 7. "Even though I had never seen him cry before, my father cried during my wedding because he was going to miss me no longer being at home."

In a restaurant, a family of five bowed their heads in prayer before beginning to eat. One of the children, a girl of about ten, expressed thanks for the entire family in a hushed voice, her head bobbing expressively. A few moments later a couple, on their way to pay their check, paused at the family's table. "It's been a long time since we've seen anyone do that," said the man, extending his hand to the father. The father smiled and replied, "It was strange at first, but we always express thanks at home before we eat. The children continued it when we went to restaurants, so we just went along with it, and now it's our way." The woman who had come up to the table patted the little girl on the shoulder and, obviously touched, looked at the mother and said, "Don't ever stop. It means a lot to those around you."

It seems like such a little thing, but it was a witness. The seeds of the Kingdom are little, and we are called to scatter them. We need to cooperate in the growth of God's Kingdom: The Kingdom of God is the growth of God's rule in human hearts that occurs when man does the will of God and surrenders his life to God. The seed of Faith lies dormant within each of us. When we permit the Holy Spirit to nurture it with TLC (tender loving care), it grows miraculously into gigantic proportions. The growth is slow and microscopic in the beginning. But this seed grows by using the power of the Holy Spirit, given to us through the word of God, the Mass, the Sacraments and prayer. As we learn God's will from His words and try to put these words into practice, we participate in the growth of God's Kingdom on earth, a growth which will be completed in our Heavenly life. But since we need the special anointing of the Holy Spirit to be doers of the word of God, let us offer our lives before God every day, asking for this special anointing.

Seeds of Love and Prayers made the Difference!

Clarence and his wife adopted a daughter who, they were told, had emotional problems. The administrator at the orphanage told Clarence frankly that the child would be better off staying there. But Clarence and his wife said Faith and love would conquer any problems, and they adopted the child. It didn't take too long, however, before they realized they had made a mistake. As year after impossible year passed, they consulted with principals, counselors, and teachers. Terms such as "character disorder," "sociopath," and "psychopathic personality" were used to describe their daughter's behavior. The experts all agreed that there was no hope for improvement. Over the years Clarence and his wife prayed, prayed long and hard, with no observable results. Eventually the girl ran away. A short time later she was caught and placed in a detention center, and later into half -way houses and foster homes. Clarence and his wife lost track of her, and they lost all hope of ever seeing her again. However, years later they did manage to reestablish contact with their daughter. They discovered, much to their amazement, that she had finished high school, attended college, married, and was raising two welladjusted children. "We lost faith," Clarence says, "but God was faithful. God never stopped answering our prayers."

From Our Pastoral Staff



From the tiniest seed we can grow something HUGE and MAGNIFICENT - Are you in?

In today's readings from Sacred Scripture Jesus compares the Reign of God to the way a tiny mustard seed grows. It's hard to comprehend how anything small and unassuming could possess the power and force to grow into something huge and magnificent. Jesus' three years of ministry with a dozen or so committed followers is a tiny seed that led to the explosion of Christianity. It was a way of life that basically sold itself. Unfortunately, the Christian way of life isn't as strong a living example as it was in the early church. But we now have an opportunity to begin in small ways to do magnificent things at St. Matthias.

A few months ago, I had shared exciting news that St. Matthias is among 43 parishes from across the United States – one of two in New Jersey – which were awarded an opportunity by the National Federation for Catholic Youth Ministry to participate in a 3-year opportunity to learn and implement Accompaniment strategies that would benefit our entire community – people of ALL ages.

Pope Francis has spoken again and again about our need to meet people in whatever circumstances life has given them and to walk with them in compassion and love. Accompaniment means to exist in association with, or to join with others. We are now forming a team of adults and teens. We still have room for a few more teens, young adults, and parents of grade-school children to lead our accompaniment initiatives at St. Matthias. We desire to build a diverse team to effectively foster accompaniment strategies to ensure the future of our church by providing opportunities to allow Christ's presence to be revealed in all our relationships.

The Accompaniment project sounds very promising because it's promoting an inter-generational aspect of ministerial engagement among a diverse community. We have a long tradition of community engagement and outreach and eagerness to embrace new models and methods of faith and parish formation. So we can do this!

In terms of accompaniment, we hope to have significantly greater involvement of the parish community with our youth spanning all facets of parish life - rather than Youth Ministry being regarded as separated and isolated from the community. We're continuing to grow youth presence ministering alongside adults during our Sunday Liturgies as youth cantors and lectors. A question would be what other opportunities shall we create to plant more seeds of faith and accompaniment wherever you find yourself?

Our hope is that the young people will believe they genuinely belong and their presence is valuable and a blessing to the faith community where our youth are known by name, accepted, and nonjudgmentally listened to and their voices heard, and their life-experiences embraced. The youth will be accompanied by adults who authentically accept them, and are willing to journey with them in faith during moments of doubts as they struggle to find meaning, purpose, and identity in the midst of their challenges and struggles - just like you and me!

In upcoming months we'll be inviting you to help us rethink the policies, the communities, the practices, the challenges, and the tensions within our parish which should change to better accompany youth in faith. And to identify our current resources to accompany and integrate our youth. An example is the Family Matters program which we're also now launching. Stay tuned to learn more!

The program's design goes beyond mere assistance, offering vital resources and advocacy to ensure individuals receive the care they deserve. What is Juneteenth?

June 19 is this Wednesday. The Emancipation Proclamation, which granted freedom to all enslaved persons, took effect on January 1, 1863. However, some Confederate states refused to abide by this Executive Order; in fact, over two years passed before Union troops were able to reach all the Confederate states and

enforce the new law. As a result, the last quarter of a million enslaved people were finally set free by Union troops in Galveston Bay, Texas on June 19,1865. This triumphant day became known as "Juneteenth" by the freed people of Texas. Juneteenth marks our country's second Independence Day. Although it has long been celebrated in the African-American community, this event remains largely unknown to most Americans. The historical legacy of Juneteenth shows the value of never giving up hope in uncertain times. Just as we praise and thank God for the emancipation of the enslaved Israelites during the Exodus, we raise our hands in prayers of gratitude for the freedom of our formerly enslaved Black Brothers and Sisters!
