



A Message From The Pastor

Dear Friends,

Happy Feast of Pentecost! Pentecost is considered the watershed event in Christianity. The Acts of the Apostles recounts the story of the original Pentecost when the Apostles and the Blessed Virgin Mary, gathered in the Upper Room, were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak in different tongues (Acts 2). Peter's speech that



During my homily last Sunday, I mentioned a group of Jesus Youth who had asked me permission to use our Church today for prayer & worship time to celebrate Pentecost. Some of our parishioners asked me about this group. So I thought of writing briefly about them.

"Jesus Youth" (JY) is an international Catholic movement that challenges young people to live a meaningful, creative and fulfilling life. This life begins with a personal, loving encounter with Jesus and continues as they grow in a joyful spirituality within a community of like-minded friends. It had its beginnings in Kerala, India, and evolved as an active part of the Catholic Charismatic Renewal of the state in the late 1970s. In 1985, the International Year of Youth, a number of youth groups came together under a single name, Jesus Youth. Jesus Youth is approved by the Vatican and is present in over 40 countries.

JY is known for its spirituality that promotes an active Catholic lifestyle that is relevant to a young layperson facing the challenges of life. The movement follows a lifestyle modelled on the life of Jesus Christ, based on the Six Pillars of **Spirituality:**

- **Prayer:** At the heart of the movement is a daily 'quiet time' with the Lord that leads to an experience of a loving friendship with Jesus and fosters a joyful attitude to life.
- Word of God: A regular time for a meditative reading of the Sacred Scripture helps to shape one's life according to God's will.
- Sacramental Life: Frequent and active participation in the seven Sacraments, with emphasis on the Eucharist and Confession
- **Fellowship:** Christian life is a call to live the life of the Trinity in communion with one's brothers and sisters in Christ through mutual support, encouragement and gentle correction.
- **Evangelization:** Fruit of an active life with Jesus is a joyful commitment to witnessing, sharing the person and message of Jesus with others. This commitment to evangelization is central to the life of every member of Jesus Youth.
- **Option for the Poor:** Willingness to serve those in need and a preferential option for the poor are the signs of a true disciple of Jesus Christ.

I have personally known many JY members some of whom are members of our own parish. They are like leaven in the bread that Jesus spoke of in Matthew 13:33 and Luke 13:20–21. I have always been edified by these youth and young adults who live a life of discipleship in their families and work place. In the name of the parish community of St. Matthias, I'm very happy to welcome the Jesus Youth of New Jersey to use our church for their Pentecost celebration of prayer, praise and fellowship.

HOPE AND HEALING AT THE BOSTON MARATHON

"Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his native language?" Acts 2: 1-11

Some years ago, an extraordinary event of hope and healing happened during the Boston Marathon. Among the many stories of generosity, courage and commitment that day was this one small moment, caught on video, that was particularly moving. The images were captured by Wes Lowery of The Washington Post.


A Massachusetts man was running in the middle of the pack, one of the thousands of runners who know they'll never win the race but run for the joy of the sport. About a third of a mile from the finish line - just past the 26-mile marker - the man started to struggle to stay on his feet. His legs started to vibrate rapidly, nearly giving out. A runner not far behind him saw what was happening. He caught up with the injured runner, wrapped the man's left arm around his shoulder and began to carry him. "We're gonna make it, we're gonna make it," he kept saying to the staggering runner, "but you're gonna have to help me get there." But the exhausted man had nothing left; he was slipping from the runner's grasp. Then another runner came along side and took the faltering runner's other arm. Two more runners, a young man and a young woman, also came to the rescue - and the four of them carried the exhausted man the last quarter-mile. They stopped just short of the finish line and the man was able to walk across on his own power. When all five crossed the line, they exchanged high fives. Nothing more was said. Then they went their own ways, satisfied that this year everyone finished Boston.

Four strangers, in the midst of completing their own races, are able to stop and help another runner finish his. Such a vision of compassion and generosity is the Spirit of God in our midst. Those marathon photographs are images of Pentecost: the unseen, immeasurable presence of God in our lives and in our Church - God's ruah ("breath") that animates us to do the work of the Gospel of the Risen One, the ruah that makes God's will our will, the ruah of God transforming us so that we might bring his life and love into our broken world.

"DID YOU EVER GET INTO ANY FIGHT?"

A little girl asked her grandfather, "Did you and grandma ever get into any fights?" The grandfather replied: "We don't talk about it very often, but there was a time when we were not getting along very well. We seemed to be picking on each a lot and finding all kinds of things to argue about and really getting on one another's nerves. Well, one day I came in from the garden and I heard a voice upstairs. I went to the stairs and heard your grandmother telling God what she could not bring herself to tell me." "Well, what did you do?" asked the grand-daughter. "I quietly walked up the stairs," he replied, "and knelt down beside her and told God my side of the story. And from that day to this, we have never had a problem which we couldn't resolve by talking it over with each other and with God. | Do you think the Holy Spirit was active in that couples' marriage? There can be no doubt. Conflict will always remain part of every relationship. The fruits of the Spirit – love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness, and self-control – will always remain critical for happy relationships with others."


OBSERVE PENTECOST EVERY DAY!



"It will always be Pentecost in the church," affirmed Oscar Romero, Archbishop of El Salvador, on Pentecost Sunday 1978, "provided the Church lets the beauty of the Holy Spirit shine forth from her countenance. When the Church ceases to let her strength rest on the Power from above which Christ promised her and which he gave her on that day, and when the Church leans rather on the weak

forces of the power or wealth of this earth, then the Church ceases to be newsworthy. The Church will be fair to see, perennially young, attractive in every age, as long as she is faithful to the Spirit that floods her and she reflects that Spirit through her communities, through her pastors, through her very life" (The Violence of Love, The Plough Pub. Co., Farmington, PA: 1998). Archbishop Romero's declaration reminds us -- as does today's Gospel -- that Pentecost is not just one day, but every day. Without breath, there is no life. Without the Spirit, the Church is a field of dry, dead bones. Fulton J. Sheen once said about the Church, "Even though we are God's chosen people, we often behave more like God's frozen people--frozen in our prayer life, frozen in the way we relate with one another, frozen in the way we celebrate our faith." Today is a great day to ask the Holy Spirit to rekindle in us the spirit of new life and enthusiasm, the fire of God's love. Let us repeat Cardinal Newman's favorite little prayer, "Come Holy Spirit:"

PENTECOST: GOSPEL BOMBS!



Some time ago now, Joseph Bayly wrote a book called the Gospel Blimp. It's about the attempt of Christian neighbors reaching out to the community for Christ. The family purchased a hot air balloon to broadcast the Gospel to the community and dropped "bombs" on the town (These "bombs" were tracts wrapped in colored cellophane). In spite of the trouble and

expense of this attempt at witnessing to Jesus, it failed miserably. The point the writer was making is that there is no substitute for loving care and personal witness, even though this is slow, time-consuming, likely to cause anxiety and even likely to create some hostility. You have probably heard these sayings, "I'd rather see a sermon than hear one", and "Actions speak louder than words." There is truth in these sayings, but there are still those times when words are necessary, and we must speak. The Gospel, by its very nature, needs to be shared. It isn't something we keep to ourselves, but, by our words and deeds of love, the Gospel speaks to the lives of people about God's love for them and His willingness to reach out and embrace everyone in his time of need. When was the last time you talked with someone outside of your circle of Christian friends about Jesus? When was it that you last attempted to share your Faith with someone or at least invited someone to your Church on a Sunday? Are you aware of the Presence of the Holy Spirit.

DO YOU BELONG TO A PENTECOSTAL CHURCH?

During the Italian occupation of Ethiopia in the days of Mussolini, Christian believers suffered considerable persecution. In his book, Fire on the Mountains, Raymond Davis tells of the love demonstrated by believers for each other during this period of affliction, which in turn made a major impression on unbelievers. For example, no provision was made to feed the prisoners in jail by the invading army. This was the responsibility of relatives and friends. Christians in the prisons had no problem, though. They were well cared for by friends and family. In fact, so much food was brought them by fellow believers and church groups that enough remained to feed the unbelieving prisoners also. This observable love, vibrant though nonverbal, brought many to seek the Lord. Such love was previously unheard of. As a result the word spread far and wide. Non-believers sought out believers to learn more about the Christian faith. When prisoners who had come to know Christ while in jail were released, they went back home and attended the nearest church. [Leslie B. Flynn, You Don't Have To Go It Alone, (Denver, Colorado: Accent Books, 1981).] It is only right, then, that we should pray that we might be a "Pentecostal Church," if we understand what that means.

THE LENS OF THE SPIRIT

Every Sunday, the villagers on a small Pacific island gather for prayer. On Sundays when the priest could not come for Mass, prayer leaders prepare for their day's services, readers are sought, and everyone sings. Unfortunately, impaired eyesight is a common problem due to the islanders' limited diets and the intense glare of the sun. The lack of electrical lighting in the simple church does not help either.

One Sunday a woman named Marguerite was the prayer leader. Her husband, Anjua, was one the readers. When Anjua stood to read, he reached over to Marguerite to borrow her glasses. When he finished, his brother Airmail, who was to read next, borrowed the glasses from Anjua. Then Airmail returned the glasses to Marguerite for the remainder of the service. The pair of glasses, shared among the community, spoke as powerfully of God's love in their midst as the words of their prayer.

Like that pair of glasses shared by a family and community, the Spirit of God is a lens in which we recognize the presence of God's love in the midst of our homes and hearths, our communities and villages. The presence of that Spirit which we celebrate today enables us to recognize what is good, what is right, what is ethical, what is of true and of lasting worth that guides us on our lives' journeys to God. The Spirit of God calls us to recognize and celebrate our connectedness to God and to one another; it gives voice to the things we believe but hesitate to articulate; it gives us the courage and grace to work for the dreams we are sometimes too cynical or fearful to hope for. May the Spirit of God, the creative "breath" of the Holy One, always blow within our hearts to enliven us with his love, transforming us in constant hope and illuminating for us the possibilities of bringing the promise of Jesus' resurrection into our homes and hearts.

THE JEWISH PENTECOST

Both the Jews and the Christians now celebrate Pentecost. Along with the Feast of the Passover and the Feast of Tabernacles, Pentecost was one of the major feasts of the Jews. During these three great Jewish festivals, every male Jew living within twenty miles of Jerusalem was legally bound to go to Jerusalem to participate in the feast. The word Pentecost is Greek for pentecostes which means "fiftieth." The feast received this name because it was celebrated fifty days after the Feast of the Passover. Another name for the Jewish Pentecost is Shebuot or "The Feast of Weeks" (the "week" of seven Sabbaths between Passover and Pentecost). It was originally a day of thanksgiving for the completion of the harvest. During Passover, the first omer (a Hebrew measure of about a bushel), of barley was offered to God. At Pentecost, two loaves of bread were offered in gratitude for the harvest. Later, the Jews added to the Feast of Pentecost the element of Yahweh's Covenant with Noah, which took place fifty days after the great deluge. Still later, they made this feast an occasion to thank God for His Sinaitic Covenant with Moses, which occurred fifty days after the beginning of the Exodus from Egypt.

THE CHRISTIAN PENTECOST

Pentecost marks the end and the goal of the PENTECOST Easter season. For Christians, it is a memorial of the day the Holy Spirit descended on the apostles and the Virgin Mary in the form of fiery tongues, an event that took place fifty days after the Resurrection of Jesus. The



Paschal mystery -- the Passion, the Death, the Resurrection, and the Ascension of Jesus -- culminates in the sending of the Holy Spirit by the Father (at the request of His Son), on Jesus' disciples. The feast also commemorates the official inauguration of the Christian Church by the apostolic preaching of St. Peter, which resulted in the conversion of 3000 Jews to the Christian Faith. Pentecost is, thus, the official birthday of the Church. But years ago, This Rock Magazine reported that there were 34,000 Protestant denominations which means that, on the average, more than sixty-nine new denominations had sprung up every year since the Reformation began in 1517. So whose birthday is it anyway? You could say, Pentecost is the birthday of the Church Jesus established nearly 2,000 years ago. Today's Scripture readings remind us that Pentecost is an event of both the past and the present. The main theme of today's readings is that the gift of the Holy Spirit is something to be shared with others. In other words, the readings remind us that the gift of the Holy Spirit moves its recipients to action and inspires them to share this gift with others.


