


The Rosary Altar Society will hold its next meeting on Sunday, June 4, at 11:00AM in the St. John XXIII Room.

From Our Senior Pastor

Mary and the Eucharist

We are in the last week of the month of May which has traditionally been seen as the month of Mary. Spring begins to take hold and flowers are in full bloom. Life springs anew from the dormancy of winter. Families return to walk in parks and



children get involved in baseball, softball, and other outdoor sports. We feel more alive and energetic (unless perhaps we suffer from seasonal allergies). With the beginning of the month of May many Catholic families build some type of altar in their homes and place a statue of Mary in a prominent position on or near the altar. Fresh flowers are kept on the altar out of devotion to Mary. And many families prepare to celebrate First Communion with children.

Mother's Day also falls in May (14 this year), the day when all of us like to reflect on the gift of our mothers. Whether they are living or deceased we remember them in some way, with prayers or with flowers and gifts to express our gratitude for the gift of life they gave us.

In the last encyclical he wrote before his death, Ecclesia de Eucharistia, Pope Saint John Paul 11 focused the church's attention on the Eucharist. In this encyclical he pointed out that the church has no better model for devotion to the Eucharist than Mary. At one point the pope meditates on the **Visitation** (feast day May 31) quoting Saint Elizabeth's words "Blessed is she who believed". He writes, "when at the Visitation, she bore in her womb the Word made flesh, she became the tabernacle-the first tabernacle in history-in which the Son of God, still invisible to our human gaze, allowed himself to be adored by Elizabeth." One of the chapters is entitled "In the school of Mary" and the pope speaks about how we are called to contemplate the face of Christ with Mary. As the church throughout the USA is about to launch the parish phase of **Eucharistic Revival** on June 11 of this year we would do well to turn to Mary in this month of May to ask her intercession for our families and our parish community.

The greatest gift many Catholics could give to their mothers this Mother's Day would be to return to regular attendance at Sunday mass. As a priest I hear so many stories from mothers of teens and young adults, of the pain and hurt they experience because their children have stopped attending mass. If you are among those who have stopped attending mass then one of the best gifts you could give your parents would be to recommit to mass every Sunday and bring your family along. May is the month of Mary and mothers and first Holy Communions. I pray it can be a time of renewal for all Catholics as we enter into this time of Eucharistic Revival contemplating the face of Christ with Mary.

(Memorial Day) To serve country, others, or God is to give your life because of your love. Dying for a good cause is a great sacrifice, but sacrificing time and spending energy in the service of your family counts too. How do you instill in your children this sense of sacrifice and service?

Marriage Tune-Up

(Pentecost) "There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit." (1 Cor. 12:4) What is one of your beloved's strengths? OK, so we all have different sacred strengths, BUT do you have the "same Spirit"? Unite yourselves in the spirit of Forgiveness. Is there anything you find difficult to forgive?

"All Quiet on the Western Front"

"Are not all these people who are speaking Galileans? Then how does each of us hear them in his native language?" Acts of the Apostles 2: 1-11

The new film All Quiet on the Western Front is a powerful adaptation of Erich Maria Remarque's classic 1929 novel. The film is eloquent and poetic and brutal and unsparing in its portrayal of the horrors of war. The story centers on Paul Baumer, a teenager who is caught up in the naïve patriotic fervor of Germany at the height of World War I. Paul and his friends enlist in the German army to fight the French. They arrogantly look forward to an easy, victory march into Paris — but they never get beyond the carnage of the trenches on the French countryside. Paul's preconceptions about the enemy and the righteousness of the conflict soon

crumble.

In an indelible scene, Paul is suddenly confronted by a French soldier in a bomb crater. In the struggle that ensues, Paul stabs the enemy combatant. The French soldier dies slowly and painfully; Paul cannot help, only watch. Paul morphs from the raw hate with which he's been taught to regard the enemy to the natural compassion he feels for the suffering of a fellow human being. As he tries to clean the mud and grime off the dead soldier's face, Paul finds the soldier's wallet, which holds a picture of his young bride and family and his identification card: "Gerard Duval, Typographer." Paul's tears turn the dried dirt on his face into more mud. Devastated with remorse, Paul begs for forgiveness from the French soldier's dead body.

"Comrade. Comrade, comrade," Paul says in French. "I am so sorry. I am so sorry." Gathering up Duval's papers and few personal effects, Paul stammers "I promise... I promise... I promise... I promise..." Paul hopes to return the possessions to Duval's family. But it's a promise he will not be able to keep.

In a moment of compassion in the midst of horror, Paul sees beyond his own fear to "see" his hated enemy in a new light: as a husband, a father, a craftsman, a human being. Paul now sees the world as envisioned by God: not a divided world of boundaries and borders and flags and uniforms, but of sisters and brothers who share the dignity of being made in the Creator's image. That's the miracle we celebrate today. What happens in the story of Pentecost is more than a miracle of instantaneous translation:

the Spirit of God breaks through the barriers of language and culture to create a community of empathy and respect, bringing different peoples together as the one people of God. It's the Spirit of God that enables us to listen as well as speak, to see from the perspective of another in order to find a common path to travel together, to find solutions to problems that incorporate the gifts of all for the good of all.

"Did you ever get into any fights?"

A little girl asked her grandfather, "Did you and grandma ever get into any fights?" The grandfather replied: "We don't talk about it very often, but there was a time when we were not getting along very well. We seemed to be picking on each a lot and finding all kinds of things to argue about and really getting on one another's nerves. Well, one day I came in from the garden and I heard a voice upstairs. I went to the stairs and heard your grandmother telling God what she could not bring herself to tell me." "Well, what did you do?" asked the grand-daughter. "I quietly walked up the stairs," he replied, "and knelt down beside her and told God my side of the story. And from that day to this, we have never had a problem which we couldn't resolve by talking it over with each other and with God."

Do you think the Holy Spirit was active in that couples' marriage? There can be no doubt. Conflict will always remain part of every relationship. The fruits of the Spirit – love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, gentleness, faithfulness, and self-control – will always remain critical for happy relationships with others.

Observe Pentecost Every day!

"It will always be Pentecost in the church," affirmed Oscar Romero, Archbishop of El Salvador, on Pentecost Sunday 1978, "provided the Church lets the beauty of the Holy Spirit shine forth from her countenance. When the Church ceases to let her strength rest on the Power from above which Christ promised her and which he gave her on that day, and when the Church leans rather on the weak forces of the power or wealth of this earth, then the Church ceases to be newsworthy. The Church will be fair to see, perennially young, attractive in every age, as long as she is faithful to the Spirit that floods her and she reflects that Spirit through her communities, through her pastors, through her very life" (*The Violence of Love*, The Plough Pub. Co., Farmington, PA: 1998).

Archbishop Romero's declaration reminds us -- as does today's Gospel -- that Pentecost is not just one day, but every day. Without breath, there is no life. Without the Spirit, the Church is a field of dry, dead bones. Fulton J. Sheen once said about the Church, "Even though we are God's chosen people, we often behave more like God's frozen people--frozen in our prayer life, frozen in the way we relate with one another, frozen in the way we celebrate our faith." Today is a great day to ask the Holy Spirit to rekindle in us the spirit of new life and enthusiasm, the fire of God's love. Let us repeat Cardinal Newman's favorite little prayer,

"Come Holy Spirit:"

"Oh, it sleeps about eighty!"

A family driving a large camper pulled up in front of the church just as the pastor started toward home. Desiring to be friendly, the pastor introduced himself and expressed his admiration for the camper. The man of the family told him rather proudly: "This camper sleeps eight people." Then he asked: "What is the capacity of your church, Pastor?" The beleaguered pastor replied rather glumly, "Oh, it sleeps about eighty." It is embarrassing sometimes how little the modern day churches resemble the Church that first Pentecost: the sound of a wind-storm, tongues of fire, disciples speaking in different languages, thousands being added to the Church and lots of excitement – excitement everywhere!

If we don't want our church to be a sleepy community, then we need to permit the Holy Spirit to take control of our lives. How?

- 1) By constantly remembering His holy presence and behaving well.
- By praying for His daily anointing so that we may fight against our temptations and control our evil tendencies, evil habits and addictions.
- 3) By asking His daily assistance to pray, listening to God through meditative Bible reading and talking to Him.
- 4) By asking the help of the Holy Spirit to do good for others and to get reconciled to God and others every day.



The Christian Pentecost

Pentecost marks the end and the goal of the Easter season. For Christians, it is a memorial of the day the Holy Spirit descended on the apostles and the Virgin Mary in the form of fiery tongues, an event that took place fifty days after the resurrection of Jesus. The Paschal mystery of the Passion, the Death, the Resurrection, and the Ascension of Jesus culminates in the sending of the Holy Spirit by the Father at the request of His Son on Jesus' disciples. The feast also commemorates the official inauguration of the Christian Church by the apostolic preaching of St. Peter which resulted in the conversion of 3000 Jews to the Christian faith. Pentecost is, thus, the official birthday of the Church. But years ago, This Rock Magazine reported that there are now 34,000 Protestant denominations which means that, on the average, more than sixty-nine new denominations had sprung up every year since the Reformation began in 1517. So whose birthday is it anyway? You could say, Pentecost is the birthday of the Church Jesus established nearly 2,000 years ago. Today's Scripture readings remind us that Pentecost is an event of both the past and the present. The main theme of today's readings is that the gift of the Holy Spirit is something to be shared with others. In other words, the readings remind us that the gift of the Holy Spirit moves its recipients to action and inspires them to share this gift 4) As a teaching and guiding God, He clarifies and constantly with others.

Pentecost is celebrated by both Jews and Christians!

Pentecost literally means 50th. It is a feast celebrated on the 50th day after the Passover feast by the Jews, who originally had it as a post-harvest thanksgiving feast. Later, the Jews included in it, the remembrance of God's Covenants with Noah after the Deluge and with Moses at Mt. Sinai. The Christians celebrated it as a feast on the 50th day after the feast of the Resurrection of Jesus.



High tide of the Holy Spirit

A ship strayed off course near San Diego some years back. It became stuck in a reef at low tide. Twelve tugboats were unsuccessful in their attempts to budge it. Finally, the captain instructed the tugs to go back home. He sighed, "I'll just be patient and wait." He waited until high tide. All of a sudden the ocean began to rise. What human power could not do, the rising tide of the Pacific Ocean did. It lifted that ship and put it back into the channel. Something like that happened to the early Church on the Day of Pentecost. They were all together in one place – confused, unmotivated and fearful – when suddenly the tide of Holy Spirit rolled in.

The role of the Holy Spirit in Christian life:

- 1) As an indwelling God, He makes us His Living Temples (I Cor
- 2) As a strengthening God, He strengthens us in our fight against temptations and in our mission of bearing witness to Christ by transparent Christian lives.
- 3) As a sanctifying God, He makes us holy through the sacraments: a) He makes us children of God and heirs of heaven through Baptism. b) He makes us temples of God, warriors and defenders of faith, through Confirmation. c) He enables us to be reconciled to God by pardoning our sins through Reconciliation. d) He gives us spiritual nourishment via the Holy Eucharist by converting bread and wine into Jesus' body and blood through
- reminds us of Christ's teachings.
- 5) As a listening and talking God, He listens to our prayers and enables us to pray, and He speaks to us mainly through the Bible. 6) As a giver of gifts, He gives us His gifts, fruits and charisms.

The Holy Spirit is at work in your life; but do you see?



The Holy Spirit, the Helper is quietly at work: in the sincere concern of a friend for our health; in the generosity of those who give us so much help; in the inner

strength we discover in times of crisis; in those moments when we admit that we have been wrong; in making a tough choice; in the resilience of people who face one bad thing after another; in times when we have dared to love even though it was hard to do so. The Holy Spirit, the Helper is quietly at work: in our taking on responsibilities that we once thought beyond us; in our refusing to let the greed of society take over our soul; in our giving thanks always even though times have been hard;

In our rising above past failures and putting past hurts behind us; in our finding a central core of peace in the midst of turmoil; in an adult patiently teaching a child selfesteem and self-control; in the person sitting quietly beside a hospital bed; in a parent praying for a troubled son or daughter. The Spirit calls us to repentance, to turn our lives around; He calls us to Faith and to take up our cross and follow Jesus. However we look at the Holy Spirit, He is always our Helper, always helping us to be what God made us to be. He helps us to be

truly great, namely, to be servants to one another. Likewise the Spirit promotes Jesus in our lives; He gathers us around the cross of Jesus; He changes our lives, helping us to be more patient and forgiving, to seek new beginnings in our relationships with one another and to let the power of God's love have the final say over the conflicts we get into. He is available to us every moment of every day as we face the choices between self-centeredness or being the God-centered people the Spirit has called us to be in Christ.

Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path nor partiality influence our actions.


Let us find in You our unity

A BOOK SIGNING BY ONE OF OUR OWN

Jeanine Valenti, our parishioner, has written her memoir, "Rise to the Occasion." She is inviting everyone to her book signing event on **Monday, June 5, at 7 pm** in our church. Here's a brief info about the book:

On November 23, 2001, one tragic second changed almost everything author Jeanine Senerote Valenti knew in her life. A thirty-seven-year-old mother of three children under the ages of ten, she experienced an accident that affected her career, her future, her home, and her body. What didn't waiver was her family, her husband, her three children, and their strong Christian faith. In fact, their faith in God grew to gigantic proportions through small miracles.

In Rise to the Occasion, she narrates the two parts to her story—the pre-injured part that holds many wonderful memories, and the post-injured part that has been transformative and gratifying in ways she couldn't imagine or predict. Her pre-injured life was Valenti's "Plan A" when she thought she controlled her destiny. That plan ended abruptly when she became a quadriplegic in one cruel second.

In this memoir, she tells how God taught her he isn't the cause of injury and why tragedies occur, especially to good people. He woke Valenti up from sound sleep on several occasions to guide her in her journey toward healing and writing.


