

Dear Friends,

#### A BETTER NEIGHBORHOOD THAN YOU THINK ...

"... the things that come out from within are what defile." Mark 7: 1-8, 14-15, 21-23

She was driving home late one rainy evening; her kids were asleep in the back seat. When she exited the highway and was approaching her street, she saw a car stalled on the side of the road. The hood was up, the car's flashers were on and a man was bent over the engine. A few feet away, a young woman held an infant in her arms and a toddler clung to her legs, shivering. She pulled over and asked if she could help or call someone.

The man looked to his wife, whose eyes were wide with fear, and then focused his attention back on the car. "No. thank you," he said tersely. "My brother will be here soon." "Well, you can at least use a little more light," she said as she opened her trunk and offered a flashlight to the man. She turned to his wife and said: "Please, sit in the car. I've got the heat on. You'll be more comfortable there." After some gentle coaxing, the woman agreed. The woman seemed to be almost afraid of her. To try to put the woman at ease, she pointed out her house that was just down the road. After a while, the brother arrived and helped the husband get the engine running again. The wife looked at her for the first time and quietly thanked her.

A few days later there was a knock on her door. It was the young mother standing on the porch holding a bouquet of flowers and a tray of cookies. "To thank you for your help the other night," the woman said. She invited the woman in and made coffee. "I wanted to apologize to you for the other night," the woman began. "You were kind to stop and help and we treated you as if you were a criminal. We're new to the area, and everyone had warned us that this neighborhood was in the 'bad part of town.' When you came along, we didn't know if we could trust you. But your kindness made us feel safe for the first time in our new home."

The good within one woman's heart changes the less-than-good "outside" of her. Her offer of help transforms a family's fear of their new environs in a "bad part of town" to a place of welcome. The kind of human being we are begins in the values of the heart, the place where God dwells within - but the evil we are capable of, the hurt we inflict on others, the degrading of the world that God created also begins "within," when God is displaced by selfishness, fear, anger, hatred. May God instill in us his spirit of compassion and justice, enabling us to transform the "bad parts" of the world outside of us into the "good" of God's Kingdom that begins within each of us.

#### MOTHER TERESA vs PRINCESS DIANA

Princess Diana captured the imagination of the world. When she married in 1981 (700 million watched it in TV), and when she met with a tragic death on August 31, 1997 her funeral was watched by 2.5 billion people on

TV. So, it would not be surprising if, on August 31, 2018 media made mention of the anniversary of her passing. It is only fitting if the media will speak about the many good things that she did, in particular the many charitable causes she tirelessly worked for. Will the media also recall that someone else who died twenty-one years ago, a little nun in Calcutta known to the world as Mother Teresa? It has been said that Mother Teresa chose the wrong week to die, overshadowed by the death of the young princess. But maybe that's the way it should be. Nothing could better reflect how warped the values of the world are. Mother Teresa wasn't accompanied by a billionaire playboy when she passed from this life to the celestial kingdom. She wasn't being driven in a high-speed luxury car. She lived and died serving the least and the lowest. She lived and died glorifying God and serving her neighbor. There's nothing wrong with little girls aspiring to grow up to be princesses. How much better, though, if all of us aspired to be more like Mother Teresa! There's nothing wrong with pomp and circumstance. There's even nothing wrong with ceremonies linked to the washing of hands, even though doctors say a little dirt is good for you, unless the ceremony of washing hands causes you to look down on those who don't observe such ceremonies, or unless you have clean hands but an impure heart.

#### MOVE FROM LIPS TO HEART!

In 1974, the top college basketball player in the country was a young man by the name of Bill Walton. At six foot eleven, he dominated college basketball. He took his team, UCLA, to their third consecutive NCAA championship, and in his senior year went on to the NBA. Bill had some adjustments to make in the NBA, and he didn't make them very well. Then abruptly he left the game. He said his heart was no longer in his playing. After some time went by, Bill Walton came back. This time his heart was in his game, and he played like it. He led the Portland Trailblazers to their first NBA championship. Then he moved on to the Boston Celtics. Now he's a television basketball announcer. It makes all the difference in the world if your heart is in what you're doing! A lot of us are trying to live our lives with our hearts in nothing or, we should say, with nothing in our hearts. We have Christ on our lips, but He's never made that journey further down. That's why we are bored. How do we move Christ from our lips to our hearts? That is the question which today's Gospel asks us.

#### WE ARE BEING WATCHED!

In many cities, we will get a ticket for speeding by mail, because video cameras on the road side or at traffic lights snap our picture as we speed by and record our speed while the camera focuses on our license plate. Video cameras are popping up everywhere, like virtual watching eyes. School districts are installing cameras in school buses to document for unbelieving parents how their children behave. YMCAs have mounted security cameras everywhere. Banks and businesses monitor the movements of suspected criminals and shop-lifters. With Webcams positioned strategically throughout the child-care center, parents can log on to the Internet to see what's happening with their babies. Buzzing along benignly through clear American skies, the Recon Spy Plane has a hidden, remotecontrolled camera that can be activated from up to 1,000 feet away. All these are meant to force citizens to behave well.

But we conveniently forget the truth that God has an all-seeing "Holycam" perched inside our souls enabling Him to see what is in our hearts and minds. We may get away with appearance-based virtual morality in society, fooling civil authorities, friends, spouse or children. But Jesus gives us a strong warning in today's Gospel: "Nothing that enters from outside can defile a person; but the things that come out from within are what defile" (Mark 7:15). Jesus is cautioning us not to be like some Pharisees who passed themselves off as pious, always performing the correct rites and keeping tradition-based observances, but whose inner lives were polluted with the stench of the graveyard.

# "Oh yes, I believe in God, but I'm not nuts about Him!"

A young coed being interviewed on television about her religious beliefs said, "Oh yes, I believe in God, but I'm not nuts about Him." According to the Gallup Poll that is a good description of how most Americans feel about God. Ninety-four percent of us believe in God. When it comes to translating that belief into action, however, most of us are clearly not nuts about Him. We have something in common with the Pharisees. Jesus once summed up the Pharisees' chief problem like this: "These people honor me with their lips, but their hearts are far from me." There is a group kin to the traditionalists that we might call Christian Secularists. This group is made up of that host of nominally committed people who fill the rolls of most churches. They bring their children to Sunday School. They use the Church to marry and bury. They visit us at Christmas and at Easter. They are not atheists or agnostics. They, like that young coed, believe in God, but they're not nuts about him. Today's Gospel is Christ's view about such followers.

# Reflect

#### THE FALL

In Albert Camus' novel *The Fall*, the central figure is a nameless lawyer who tells his story to a stranger he meets in a Dutch bar. The anonymous lawyer relates how he had always prided himself on being a selfless servant of humanity, a man of noble virtue and generosity. But then one dark rainy midnight, something happened to shatter his self-righteous image. As he was walking home over a bridge, he passed by a slim young woman leaning over the rail and staring into the river. Stirred by the sight of her, he hesitated a moment, and then walked on. After crossing the bridge he heard a body striking the water, a cry repeated several times, and then the midnight silence again. He wanted to do something to save her, but stood there motionless for a while and then went home. The nameless lawyer in Camus' story reminds us in some ways of the Pharisees in today's Gospel. The Pharisees were experts in the law and prided themselves on their scrupulous observance of it. And yet Jesus castigated them for their hypocrisy by quoting the prophet Isaiah: "This people pay me lip service but their heart is far from me" (Albert Cylwicki, His Word Resounds). We need to keep the spirit of the Church's laws and practices. For example our Sunday obligation is intended to allow us to worship God in the parish community, to offer our lives to God, to ask His pardon for our sins, to thank God for His blessings, to present our needs before Him and to receive Divine Life and strength from Him in receiving Holy Communion. Our daily family prayers are meant to thank God for His blessings, to present the family's needs before God, to ask pardon for all our sins, and to maintain the spirit of unity and love in the family.

# Reflections on the National Eucharistic Congress: Emile Capuno Today we continue with Emile Capuno's 2nd instalment on her experience in Indianapolis:

The Eucharistic Revival was a response by the U.S Bishops to polls and surveys indicating that there has been a steady decline in Sunday Mass attendance, and the loss of belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. The 10th National Eucharistic Congress has been in the works for nearly three years and is part of a larger three-year Eucharistic Revival launched by the U.S. bishops on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi in 2022. The last time there was a National Eucharistic Congress here in the United States was in 1941, 83 years ago!

The NEC featured an Exhibit Hall where every Catholic apostolate, ministry, movement, religious community, entrepreneur, and product seemed to be represented. Many Catholic cosmetics companies, financial advisors, health-care ministries and schools celebrated their unique place in the Church.

Every morning, we gather at Lucas Oil Stadium to pray the Family Rosary Across America live on Relevant Radio, then various expressions of the Church's liturgy were beautifully offered. There was Mass in English, Spanish, and Vietnamese, an Eastern Rite liturgy: Syro-Malabar Qurbana, a Byzantine Divine Liturgy, a Byzantine Hierarchical Vigil Divine Liturgy, a Mass for Youth, and a Mass According to the 1962 Missal. Cardinal Luis Antonio Tagle, papal envoy to the NEC, celebrated Mass for the Filipino community at Saints Peter and Paul Cathedral on Thursday, while Bishop James Checchio celebrated Mass for the NEC pilgrims from the Diocese of Metuchen on Friday.

After Mass, we (thousands of bishops, priests, seminarians, women religious with different colored habits, families with young children, some even have up to 8 kids) attended Impact sessions, afternoon Breakout sessions, and evening Revival sessions. These sessions included popular and inspiring Catholic speakers from all over the country. Each evening concluded with Eucharistic Adoration, with all forms of absolutely beautiful music, from Gregorian chant to contemporary. The Eucharistic procession, on Saturday afternoon, through downtown Indianapolis was the most public display of love and devotion to the Eucharist as pilgrims dropped to their knees as the Eucharistic Lord passed by. Wow! I am so thankful and proud of my faith!!

This program is designed to help participants navigate this uncertainty in a safe, non judgmental environment with others who share many of the same feelings. The program uses a guide to help foster discussion among the small group of participants.

Each session lasts about one hour. Meetings will be on Wednesdays gathering either in the afternoon or early evening depending on the schedule needed by those participating. #### UPDATE ABOUT OUR CHURCH MEDIA PROJECT

After announcing for some time that the preparations are on for installing our new projection and livestream system, we are now in its final stage. The Technicians will be here this week to complete the installation of the screen, projector, cameras etc. Some of our parishioners have voiced their concern about projecting images or placing screen on the wall as they feel that we are violating the sanctity of the sanctuary. That would have been a concern in any other church where the sanctuary and wall are contiguous or in close proximity. It is not the case in our church. Our sanctuary and altar are surrounded by people. There is a distance of over 20 feet between the altar and the wall, and our choir is filling that gap. Hence the concern some of our parishioners feel is not applicable in our case considering the unique layout of our church. Having the sanctuary with the altar and the pulpit in the center with people surrounding it is what makes us uniquely a Eucharistic community.

The new livestream system, with its high-definition remote-controlled cameras, will vastly improve image brightness and contrast. Mr. Jeff Beck and Mr. Joe Mancuso have been working tirelessly on this project. We hope to see a very much improved experience of the media use in our church. We are grateful to the parishioners who have been volunteering to help with the tech part of projecting the slides for our Sunday Masses. We wish to invite more such tech-savvy parishioners to consider volunteering to help with the live-streaming once the media update is complete.


#### RETREAT OPPORTUNITY FOR WOMEN OF OUR PARISH
