Pulpit Announcements for the The Great Easter Vigil April 19, 2025





Our response is: "Jesus Our Resurrection, hear our prayer."

- 1. For Pope Francis, for all Church leaders, and for the whole Church that we may be instruments of Christ's light for all who live in darkness, as we continue to witness to the joyful truth of the resurrection, we pray. . .
- 2. For Annika (ANI-ka), Johan (Joe-han), Daiane (Day-annie), and Xander (Zander), whom we have welcomed today into the Catholic family of faith;...That they may have the help and guidance of the Holy Spirit to persevere faithfully in the choice they have made, we pray. . .
- 3. For John, Cruz, Jorge, Richard, Tammy, Madison, Nailah (Nigh-lah), Chigoziri (Chigo-ziri), Chiamaka (Chia-maka), Nneoma (Ne-oma), Shana, Ava, and Brianna, whom we welcome into full Communion with us today...that the power of the Holy Spirit will guide their path to holiness, we pray...
- 4. For the poor, especially the homeless, the marginalized, the immigrant, those seeking asylum, For those who live in the darkness of addiction, sin and ignorance, that, they may not live in fear, but rather in the knowledge that they are loved and cared for, we pray. . .
- 5. For all who are chronically or terminally ill, and for all ailing in body, mind, or spirit...for those who feel isolated or depressed, and those who feel forgotten, that the Risen Lord will bring them out of darkness and bring light and hope to their hearts, we pray . . .
- 6. For all who have died, especially **Don Roeske** ... that they will be greeted by the *Risen Lord*, we pray . . .
- 7. For those prayers we hold in the depths of our hearts, we pray. . .
