Dear Brothers in Christ,



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On October 22, as we observe World Mission Sunday, we stand in solidarity with the Missions of the Church in this annual worldwide Eucharistic celebration.

Pope Francis reflected on this year's theme: "Hearts on fire, feet on the move." The Holy Father invites us to kindle the fire of Christ's love in our hearts and to actively share this warmth with the world around us. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, we go forth and bring the Good News to all corners of the world.

Founded by French laywoman Blessed Pauline Jaricot in 1822, the Society for the Propagation of the Faith is an essential source of aid for the Church's missionary work. In the United States, we benefited from these donations: up until 1908, we received close to 7 million dollars, the equivalent of over 250 million today. Those dioceses in our country, considered mission territories, continued to receive subsidies. Fairbanks, Alaska, was the last of those dioceses and received its final subsidy payment this year!

The World Mission Sunday collection assists the Holy Father meet his Petrine obligation to build up the Church in over 1,100 dioceses and territories that are too young and/or too poor to sustain themselves. Offerings support the formation of seminarians and religious men and women, assist in the construction of schools and orphanages and enables missionaries to build churches in remote and resource-limited areas, and to meet essential works to proclaim the Gospel and celebrate the Sacraments.

Embodying this year's theme, I urge you to keep your hearts aflame and your feet moving this World Mission Sunday. Your prayers are invaluable, and your financial support provides lifegiving aid to our brothers and sisters in the world's most vulnerable communities.

El 22 de octubre, al conmemorar el Domingo Mundial de las Misiones, nos unimos en solidaridad con las Misiones de la Iglesia en esta celebración eucarística mundial anual.

"Corazones encendidos, pies en camino" es el tema que el Papa Francisco eligió para este año. El Santo Padre nos invita a avivar el fuego del amor de Cristo en nuestros corazones y a compartir activamente este calor con el mundo que nos rodea. Inspirados por el Espíritu Santo, avanzamos y llevamos la Buena Noticia a todos los rincones del mundo.

Fundada por una laica francesa, la Beata Pauline Jaricot en 1822, la Sociedad para la Propagación de la Fe es una fuente esencial de ayuda para la obra misionera de la Iglesia. En los Estados Unidos, nos beneficiamos de estas donaciones: hasta 1908, recibimos cerca de 7 millones de dólares, lo que equivale a más de 250 millones en la actualidad. Aquellas diócesis en nuestro país consideradas territorio misionero continuaron recibiendo subsidios incluso hasta la actualidad. ¡Fairbanks, Alaska, recibió su último subsidio este año!

La colecta del Domingo Mundial de las Misiones ayuda al Santo Padre a cumplir con su obligación petrina de edificar la Iglesia en más de 1,100 diócesis y territorios donde la Iglesia es demasiado joven y/o pobre para sostenerse por sí misma. Las ofrendas apoyan la formación de seminaristas y religiosos y religiosas, ayudan en la construcción de escuelas y orfanatos, y permiten a los misioneros construir iglesias en áreas remotas y con recursos limitados, y realizar obras esenciales para proclamar el Evangelio y celebrar los Sacramentos.

Incorporando el tema de este año, les insto a mantener sus corazones encendidos y sus pies en camino este Domingo Mundial de las Misiones. Sus oraciones son invaluables y su apoyo financiero brinda ayuda vital a nuestros hermanos y hermanas en las comunidades más vulnerables del mundo.

Dear Brothers in Christ,

On October 21-22, the Universal Church celebrates World Mission Sunday. This global Eucharistic celebration for the Church's missions is an opportunity to remind our parishioners of their own call to be missionary disciples. We assist the Holy Father exercise his Petrine obligation to support the Church in the missions by praying for our missionaries and financially supporting their ministry.

World Mission Sunday, organized by the Pontifical Society for the Propagation of the Faith, one of the four Pontifical Mission Societies, is the only canonically mandated collection in the Church. This year, the spirit of Pope Francis's theme, "Hearts on fire, feet on the move," resonates with us as we are reminded of the energetic and unwavering faith that fuels our shared mission.

For the past 201 years, the Society for the Propagation of the Faith has extended its arms to support growing Churches globally, reaching more than 1,100 mission dioceses across Asia, Africa, the Pacific Islands, Latin America, and parts of Europe. This assistance bolsters the proclamation of the Gospel, the building of the Church, and service to the poor. Let us echo this spirit in our parishes, inspiring our congregations to contribute both prayer and sacrifice to this cause on World Mission Sunday.

The World Mission Sunday collection in the United States supports CNEWA (Catholic Near East Welfare Association) aiding the Oriental Churches in need with 9% of the contributions. It also supports the Pontifical Council on Latin America, that directs 5% of the gifts to aid the poorest jurisdictions in South America and the Caribbean. The balance (86%) supports the Church in those dioceses in Africa and Asia which are designated as mission territories. Last year, the Society for the Propagation of the Faith in the United States sent over \$23 million to the bishops, priests, religious brothers and sisters and lay missionaries who help spread the Gospel in these territories.

As Cardinal-elect Christophe Pierre's wrote to us bishops in the United States last year, our support to World Mission Sunday "makes possible the proclamation of the Gospel, the celebration of the Sacraments, and service to the poor in mission dioceses. For the first decades of its life, the fledgling Church in the United States received essential support from the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, and the Catholics of this country have returned that generosity in abundance."

Your role in echoing this call to your congregations is paramount. Your voices carry great influence and can be the spark that inspires the "hearts on fire, feet on the move" spirit that Pope Francis calls us to embody.
